



Vases des Jardin des Tuileries

Location: Paris, France

Architects: Juan Garaizabal

Born in Madrid in 1971, Juan Garaizabal is a conceptual artist best known internationally for his monumental public sculptures. His "Urban Memories" recuperate lost architectural elements by means of sculpture and light.

One of the most recent works is "Vases des Jardin des Tuileries", his interpretation of the vases that once stood in the garden of Tuileries Palace in Paris, made of stainless steel and wood or brick. This project consists on the temporary recreation of the Palais des Tuileries, a royal palace in Paris which stood on the right bank of the River Seine until 1871, when it was destroyed by fire in the upheaval during the suppression of the Paris Commune. It closed off the western end of the Louvre courtyard, which has remained open since the destruction of the palace.
